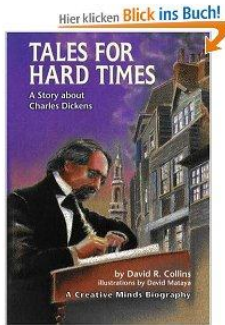


(1) Find the book „Tales for Hard Times- A Story about Charles Dickens“
